



NEWSLETTER EDITOR'S REPORT for the Annual General Meeting – Tuesday 4 April 2023

In my report last year, I intimated that I hoped to produce two Newsletters during 2022, the first since early 2020. In the event, I only managed to produce just one, towards the end of the year. Looking back through my records, I found that I have been producing our Newsletters since 2009, so, as was indicated in the notice of this AGM, I feel it is about time to put away my e-pencil, and hand over to someone else. I have given your Committee notice that I wish to stand down after 15 years at next year's AGM, when I hope my report, then, will thank another of our members for taking over the post, and to offer him or her every good wish.

Finally, 'Thank You' to those who provided material for the 2022 Newsletter, to the Committee, who are very good proof-readers and providers of suggested amendments to the content and to Chris Hall, our web-site manager and others for providing a number of photographs for me.
